History of the 'Peace in the Northeast March'

In March 2008 members of the LAPD joined a growing group of community leaders attending the monthly gathering of pastors in Northeast Los Angeles. The pastors had long been concerned about safety in their neighborhoods, spending time together sharing resources, outreach opportunities, and prayers with one another. That day they were challenged with the question, "Why don't you do something about the violence in the community?"

The next month Captain William Murphy, the new commanding officer of the Northeast Division LAPD, suggested holding a Peace March to unite neighborhoods in the community. That same day, a date was chosen, tasks parceled out, and the march planning begun!

Four months later -- on Saturday, August 16, 2008 -- two thousand people came together and marched 2.3 miles from the center of Highland Park, at York and Figueroa, to Victory Outreach Church Eagle Rock. At the end of the march, there was free food, music, stories of hope and God's goodness, and over 50 groups eager to share resources for improving individual, family, and community life.

The Peace March has since become an annual event in the Northeast area, which serves as a powerful testament to how people are willing to come together when needed, take action, and become one united voice for change.
